CATHOLIC MINISTRY FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE DEAF OR HEARING IMPAIRED

The Catholic Ministry is for people who are deaf or hearing impaired and it works out ways that people can join in with Mass and the Parish community. They help by doing things at Mass to make people feel welcome. They can talk to people and listen to them.

They can work out ways that people can use what they are good at and share this in different ways.

- Engagement: Supporting all people to access Mass. We can include all the words from Mass on a PowerPoint, and there could be an Auslan interpreter. It is important to ask the people what they would like provided for Mass.
- Access: There could be big letters written on Mass cards and newsletters for those people that can't see well to let everyone know that they are welcome.
- **Responsibility:** Giving jobs to everyone. The hearing impaired and deaf could be asked to do a reading at Mass, or do the offertory, or be a collector. There can also be things that need to be done outside of Church like helping Father in the garden and doing jobs outside. Seeing what people are good at or like to do and give them a job.
- Support others: See what you can do to help someone else; ask them what they need.
- Social connection: Help everyone feel like they are part of the Church community. This
 could be by using Auslan interpreters or a hearing loop, which is listening to the Mass in
 a hearing aid.



CENTACARE EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING

- Centacare is an organisation who works to transform lives through education, training and employment.
- They are a not-for-profit organisation who support disadvantaged members of the community gain the education, skills and qualification to gain employment.

The name Centrecare was made in the 1970s to describe these services. They are still being delivered by the Catholic people of Perth today .





IDENTITYWA

Identity Wa helps support people in communities with disabilities and special needs to participate and contribute as valued members of the community.

• Identity Wa is one of Western Australia's leading agencies supporting people with disabilities and their families. They provide support to children and adults throughout the Perth metropolitan area.

• Their goal is to build a community with a sense of purpose, and well-being.



DAYDAWN ADVOCACY CENTRE

DayDawn is a society on behalf of the Aboriginal people to provide education, worship God and to socialize with other people.

Their purpose is to negotiate with the government so that Aboriginal people can get nice jobs, get paid, and live a good life. They also provide money.

The name comes from a little abandoned town in the Mid-West/upper Murchison region of Western Australia that used to be a thriving mining town and mine. A man called Ned Heffernan found a large amount of rich gold in the mine in the 1891 near cue. It Is one of the societies funded by Lifelink.

DAYDAWN ADVOCACY CENTRE

They have their own center at Piccadilly Square Cathedral Aberdeen St, Perth, WA 6000.

They also provide medical help or mental help to any Aboriginal person in need.

Daydawn is mainly staffed and resourced by volunteers. Any Aboriginal person in need can come for help at no cost at all. They also particularly help the Noongar people from Geraldton to the North.

One of the staff is Dr Betsy Buchanan and has helped generations of Aboriginal people. The DayDawn society also tries their best to stop domestic violence and help others as best as they can.



Information

Emmaus Community provides independent for adult with mental illness. This social housing model offers a respectful safe and supportive home for those who live there. Family and friends can share lunches exhibitions and special events and event in general. You can find the Emmaus Community in Queens park in Westen Australia. It started in 1996 by Br Al Archer. When he started it, it was for 7 adults but now it is homed to 50 adults. To this day Br Al Acher live and works full time in the community
