#### New Directions for Unemployment

According to Australian Bureau of Statistics, almost 200,000 Australians that want to work have unemployed for over a restrictive definitions suggest the figure could be over twice this.

Over the last twenty years the number of people in longterm unemployment has moved up sharply with each recession and then failed to return to pre recession levels when the economy has fully recovered.

This level of long-term unemployment is unacceptable in a country that has enjoyed strong economic growth for

highest job vacancy levels in over ten years.

These facts are widely known, and policy makers, academics and others have not ignored year or more. Less the issue. Many regional, state wide and national initiatives have been launched to address the issue. There have been successes but, despite the The problem is not a recent extensive research, good intentions and significant expenditure, the problem remains.

Concerted action is required on many fronts - from broader strategies focused on jobs growth, reducing demand volatility, eliminating 'poverty traps' and reinforcing mutual obligations, to supply-side programs at the community and individual levels, aimed at supporting high risk groups through difficult life transitions almost a decade and has the as well as training the

unemployed to fill areas of jobs growth and skills shortage.

The coexistence of a strong economy and persistent high levels of long-term unemployment suggests that the latter strategies must be a critical part of the solution.
