To see a real life example of the problem and how it affects people and how you can help them To see who you're donating too and what the donations are doing to help the families in need.

It would be important to intergrate it into courses at schools, like a cooking class who can make a batch of food for homeless once or a couple times a term.

Instead of in school RE lessons, we have an activity based volunteer session externally Working with other young people would encourage students to volunteer and get involved as often students find that they are the only young person volunteering in a group of adults.
